Cameron Rapp, the General Manager of Development Services for the City of Waterloo will explain the amazing "intensification" of the City of Waterloo. Many properties up to 25 storeys are already approved and many more are in the process. Some of these projects, known as "vertical communities" will be home to over 3,500 residents, as well as combine commercial and retail space at ground levels.

Cameron began his career with the planning department at the City in 1987, after graduating from the University of Waterloo. Starting as a planning technician he has worked in a variety of planning and municipal roles until achieving his current position which includes planning, building and expansion engineering in 2006. Cameron has made presentations locally and to international audiences regarding intensification as well as teaching engagements at the University of Waterloo. Cameron has worked with a variety of groups including Council, citizens, the development and building industry and other agencies to ensure that Waterloo develops and grows as a dynamic and prosperous community.
